READING: Mark 16:1-8

When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go to anoint Jesus' body. ² Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb ³ and they asked each other, 'Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?'

⁴ But when they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had been rolled away. ⁵ As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed.

⁶ 'Don't be alarmed,' he said. 'You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. ⁷ But go, tell his disciples and Peter, "He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you."

⁸Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid.

EASTER REFLECTION: WHY ARE WE HERE (8) To proclaim the risen Lord

Have you ever done a jigsaw only to find that one piece is missing and you cannot complete the puzzle? Or you've recorded a programme and just as the vital ending was about to be revealed the recording stopped. Isn't it frustrating! We have something like this here in Mark's gospel with the resurrection story. The ending seems to be missing.

You and I know the resurrection story. We know that Jesus appeared to Mary Magdalene in the garden on the day of resurrection, but that's in John's gospel (John 20:10-17). We know that Jesus spoke with two disciples on the road to Emmaus, but that in Luke's gospel (Luke 24:13-35). We know that there was an earthquake and the soldiers guarding the tomb became like dead men, and as the women hurried away from the tomb with the news of Jesus' resurrection they met him and worshipped him, but that's in Matthew's gospel (Matthew 28:1-10). All these things we know about the resurrection appearances of Jesus are in the other gospels.

Did you know that there is no resurrection appearance from Jesus in Mark's gospel. Take a look. It's not there. Some Biblical scholars are convinced that Mark's gospel didn't originally end with the words, `They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid' (v8). It is such an unusual ending. Many scholars think the last page of the manuscript went missing, which was not uncommon in ancient times. But why would God allow the original ending to disappear? There were indeed some in ancient times who thought the ending was missing, which is why they added v9-20, but the oldest manuscripts don't have v9-20.

Other scholars do think that v8 is where Mark originally ended, with the women in fear and silence, for in Mark's gospel Jesus is often telling people to stay silent, and that's what the women did here. They say that instead of a simple happy ending, Mark has given us something more powerful, a strange puzzle for the reader, wondering what on earth must have happened and what it all means.

Whichever argument you believe, we should remember that Jesus told his disciples again and again that he would suffer and die and be raised to life (8:31; 9:12; 14:27-28). At the time they didn't understand what Jesus meant, but Mark doesn't want his readers to go on being puzzled, and neither do I want you to be puzzled. So, let's deal with what's here rather than what isn't.

Mark lists three women as witnesses of Jesus' death, the two Marys and Salome (15:40), although there were many others present at the cross whom Mark doesn't name. The two Marys, Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Joses also saw where Jesus was buried (15:47). These women did not have time to collect the appropriate spices to anoint Jesus' body before his burial as it was nearly the Sabbath when Jesus was laid in the tomb.

So early on the Sunday morning it was these three women that made their way back to the tomb, and as they went they wondered, "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?" (v3). It's an obvious question. Tomb stones were heavy and they knew they couldn't move it. You can see from this question that they were not thinking about resurrection, they were thinking about anointing the dead. They were grieving and simply went to do for Jesus what was necessary, to complete the burial process.



Naturally, the three women got the shock of their lives when they arrived. The shock was that the tomb stone was already rolled away. In one sense that was good news. Job done. They could now anoint Jesus' body. But a second shock to hit them was that a young man dressed in white calmly spoke to them, saying 'You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified.' Yes, they were. So, this was the correct tomb; they hadn't mistaken it for another. The young man went on to say, 'He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him' (v6). The body of Jesus was gone. No need for the spices then.

If anyone says to you 'I don't believe in the resurrection' just ask them, 'What happened to Jesus' body?' People have tried to disprove the resurrection, but why would the followers of Jesus die for something they knew to be a lie?

'Who moved the stone' is a the story about Frank Morrison's attempt to look deeply into the last days of Jesus' life and ultimately to disprove the resurrection. He ended up writing a different book altogether. It's an old book but worth a read if you want to go through a methodical mental process of understanding what really happened and why. He writes, 'If the women's statement was true, and the remains of Jesus were no longer in the tomb, it would be easy to test that fact... However baffling and disconcerting it may seem at first sight, the evidence for the essential accuracy of the women's story is overwhelming in its consistency and strength' (p116).

So the women hurried off to tell Peter and the other disciples the astonishing news, and that they would see Jesus in Galilee. But the gospel finishes with the women fleeing from the tomb `trembling and bewildered' (v8). Their reaction is consistent with grief and shock. Trembling is a physical reaction and bewilderment is a mental reaction.

There Mark's gospel ends. At least the oldest manuscripts end there. The announcement of the angel to the three women was that Jesus was not dead but alive. The centurion's declaration at cross that `Surely this man was the Son of God' was confirmed on Easter morning. The powers of evil had done their worst, but they did not have the final word and never will. As Paul says in one the earliest Christian documents, `But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead' (1 Corinthians 15:20).

For Mark's readers, who endured such terrible persecution, Mark's resurrection message would have been a great encouragement. God will have the last word, and those who commit themselves to him will be vindicated. It's a message of encouragement that we need reminding of today. We are living in difficult times, where there is a lot of trembling and bewilderment. So what message can we take away this Easter?

In the darkness of grief and pain and loss, these things do not and will not have the final word. The final word on life and death and eternal life belongs to Jesus, who conquered death and is alive. The crucified Lord is the resurrected Lord. The difficulty we have today is not that others don't believe it, but that we don't believe it enough. We have heard the story so often that it fails to move us. But it is astonishing! It is revolutionary! It is true!

As you know, my Mum died in January. Yes, I miss her and would love to talk to her again. I would like to hear her wisdom and give her a hug. But I know I will not be parted from her for ever. She had a strong faith in the risen Lord Jesus and was looking forward to being with him. When faced with the stark reality of death, resurrection seems absurd. When I looked into her coffin and saw her body, it seemed as though death laughed, but I will have the last laugh because Jesus lives, and because he lives my Mum lives, and I too will live even though one day I'll die. This Easter you also will live if you trust in him. Let's pray.

God our Father, we thank you for Mark's gospel and for the three women who are not so different from us. In our fear and trembling, help us to declare the truth that Christ is risen; to the glory of your holy name. **Amen.**
