READING: Daniel 6:1-9

It pleased Darius to appoint satraps to rule throughout kingdom, ² with three chief ministers over them, one of whom was Daniel. The satraps were made accountable to them so that the king might not suffer loss. 3 Now Daniel so distinguished himself among the chief ministers and the satraps by his exceptional qualities that the king planned to set him over the whole kingdom. ⁴ At this, the chief ministers and the satraps tried to find grounds for charges against Daniel in his conduct of government affairs, but they were unable to do so. They could find no corruption in him, because he was trustworthy and neither corrupt nor negligent. ⁵ Finally these men said, 'We will never find any basis for charges against this man Daniel unless it has something to do with the law of his God.'

⁶So these chief ministers and satraps went as a group to the king and said: 'May King Darius live for ever! ⁷The royal ministers, prefects, satraps, advisors and governors have all agreed that the king should issue an edict and enforce the decree that anyone who prays to any god or human being during the next thirty days, except to you, Your Majesty, shall be thrown into the lions' den. 8 Now, Your Majesty, issue the decree and put it in writing so that it cannot be altered - in accordance with the law of the Medes and Persians, which cannot repealed.' 9 So King Darius put the decree in writing.

REFLECTION: MAKING SENSE OF THE TIMES (6) The witness that faced the

As we have been watching events unfold in Ukraine, it has made me think of this passage in Daniel 6; not the lion's den part but the fact that one kingdom had been taken over by another. The Babylonian

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Empire was gone and the Persian Empire had conquered it. Daniel had seen Nebuchadnezzar and Belshazzar come and go. Now Darius the Mede was in charge, but Daniel is still serving the LORD God of Israel.

Daniel was one of many Jews exiled to Babylon. He rose to become one of the top three politicians in the country by the time we reach Daniel 6. He had a busy job and great responsibility. By this time Daniel had lived in Babylon many years and he played a full part in the life of the state. He was an exceptional and distinguished leader, and Darius planned to set Daniel over the whole kingdom (6:3). There are two themes in this passage which I want to explore this morning - the character of leaders, and the continuous conflict between the kingdom of light, God's kingdom, and the kingdom of darkness.

Firstly, the character of leaders. Daniel had been promoted by Darius because of his exceptional qualities (v3) and because Darius didn't want to suffer loss (v2). Then as now the trust in public office was used to advance personal interests, yet Darius found in Daniel a man whom he could trust, a man of distinguished character. Even when others implied that Daniel was not to be trusted because he was 'one of the exiles from Judah' (v13), and liable to rebel against Darius, it was clear that Darius could trust Daniel more than he could trust his own people because of his character. In the midst of corruption and professional jealousy, Daniel stood out as a man governed by a sense of loyalty and integrity that stemmed from his right relationship with God. Daniel served God continually (v16, 20), and was recognised as a servant of the living God (v20) over and above him being a servant of Darius.

We are living in times when trust in public office is at an all-time low because we have found that our leaders have compromised their integrity - from the MP's expenses scandal to parties during lockdown, and now to Ukraine and the weakness of response to scheming. Character matters, and we need leaders of character. This week I met Methodist Superintendent the Minister, Rev. Andrew Burrows. In him the Methodist Circuit, which includes this church, have a man of character and trustworthiness, who is willing to take difficult decisions for the sake of God's kingdom.

And that leads to my second theme, the clash of kingdoms - the kingdom of light and the kingdom of darkness. On this occasion this clash has its focus on the laws of these two kingdoms. unchangeable law of the Medes and Persians was used by unscrupulous men to attempt to overcome the laws of God's kingdom by which the righteous are ultimately vindicated. It says in v21-22, `Daniel answered, "O King, live for ever! My God sent his angel, and he shut the mouths of the lions. They have not hurt me, because I was found innocent in his sight. Nor have I ever done any wrong before you, O king."' We discover that kingdoms may make their laws but they are all subject to the law of God's kingdom. President Putin may consider that, playing the long game over many years, he has outwitted the western leaders and for a second time made a land grab of parts of Ukraine. But he will not have the final say. Neither will President Zelensky of Ukraine or President Biden of the USA. The LORD will have the final say. What we need to pray for is for people like Daniel, people of integrity and trust,

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to be raised up in these countries, and also in our own country.

Leaders can be easily duped, as in the case of Putin who has duped other leaders, and in the case of Darius, who was duped by his own leaders, the governors and satraps (v4-9). The powers of darkness tried to wear Daniel down by wave after wave of attacks on his faithfulness to God. By this point in Daniel's life he was probably around 70-80 years old. The new law about not praying other than to Darius was a temptation to Darius' ego and a way of finally overcoming Daniel. This whole story about Daniel's continuous prayer three times a day and being thrown into the lion's den is a sober reminder that whatever age we are there will be temptations to compromise our faith. These temptations are never isolated incidents in our spiritual life but part of a larger strategy of Satan against us.

Next week we enter the season of Lent, a season that begins by remembering the temptations in the wilderness, of Jesus being tempted to compromise and so fall at the first hurdle. We should not mistake a single battle for the whole war. We may overcome Satan at one point, but we should not relax thinking that the assaults are over. If we let our guard down, that's when the enemy comes in like a flood (Isaiah 59:19). Daniel's greatest test came at the end of his life, not at the beginning. In the same way Jesus' greatest test was not the temptations in the wilderness but the cross.

If we take this passage as an example of the kingdom of darkness trying to overcome the kingdom of light, it's important for us to remember that one of the chief functions of temptation from God's perspective is to strengthen us. As we successfully resist the devil and his schemes to derail us in our following Christ, we are enabled to meet even greater tests in the future. However, many Bible characters stumbled and fell, yet even in these God used the process of restoration to equip and strengthen his people. So, if you're sitting there thinking "Well, I've already failed", then remember Abraham, Moses, David, Solomon and a whole list of people who failed and got up again to serve the living God. Satan tries to wear us down. That was his tactic with Daniel, but like Daniel, we should not be taken by surprise.

The importance of character, and the clash of kingdoms. When we are tempted to compromise on our faith, when we think that everything seems to be going wrong, it is time to trust in God, put our faith into action. Are there public practices that are incompatible with your commitment to Christ? Before Daniel faced the actual lions he faced the lions of corrupt colleagues and the temptation to compromise. What lions are you facing that have the power to make you turn from following Christ? Family members who don't believe, work colleagues who would rather see the back of you, health problems that seem to chip away at your faith? Remember Daniel and whatever you are facing this week, be a person of character who prays, and trust that God's kingdom shall prevail, just as God prevailed in saving Daniel.
