Reading Acts 1: 1 - 11

Jesus Taken Up Into Heaven

1 In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach 2 until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. 3 After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. 4 On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. 5 For John baptized with[a] water, but in a few days, you will be baptized with[b] the Holy Spirit."

6 Then they gathered around him and asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?"

7 He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. 8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

9 After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight.

10 They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. 11 "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

This is the Word of the Lord.

Reflection

May the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be pleasing in your sight, O Lord, my strength and my Redeemer.

Lord be with each one of us as we prepare to hear your word this morning may our hearts and minds be stilled and able to block out interruptions and concentrate on you this morning. **Amen.**

Opening discussion – Ascension and Theophilus

Our reading today starts with the greeting Dear Theophilus, who was Theophilus? I think, however, a more revealing question is, "Are you Theophilus?" This depends on which view we take, some argue that Theophilus was real person, either a jew in Alexandria, a roman official, Paul's lawyer in Rome, or even the high priest at the temple in Jerusalem. Or it could be an honorary title meaning one loved by God, but it could also be one who loves God. The main part of our reading is dealing with the ascension a topic often overlooked in some churches, but it is an integral part of our faith.

Imagine what would have happened if after the resurrection and ascension that was all that happened, end of story or if the ascension never happened. One bible commentator argues there would be no church today, perhaps because up to now all the instructions where to wait in Jerusalem. If the apostles had followed the pattern set out in Acts 1, they would never have left Jerusalem. They might have formed a tribute act, a society for the preservation of Christ's teachings. In short, they would have been nothing more than a footnote in history. That is why the ascension is so important to us, whether we remember it or not.

Timeline

But first a bit of context. Scripture tells us that Jesus stayed on earth for a period of time, usually taken as 40 days when he appeared to many in his resurrection body. 1 Corinthians 15: 6 says, "that the Messiah died for our sins, exactly as Scripture tells it; that he was buried; that he was raised from death on the third day, again exactly as Scripture says; that he presented himself alive to Peter, then to his closest followers, and later to more than five hundred of his followers all at the same time, most of them still around (although a few have since died)"

So, our timeline looks something like this with Jesus walking the earth, meeting with the disciples, meeting with large numbers of his followers. However, his glorified body was not for this earth and so Jesus returned to heaven. Firstly, I must confess the disciples were very patient not sure I'd be waiting 40 or 50 days. What can we take away from our reading this morning?

There are seven aspects I want to pick up on.

1. Earthly ministry completed

Some may see the ascension as the end of God's might acts on earth when Jesus returned to heaven. However, we might say no they have only just begun. It is true to say that at the



ascension Jesus had achieved all he came down to earth to achieve, hence his earthly ministry is complete. He came as our saviour and as such he paid the price for our sin, we can see this clearly in Mark 10: 45, 45 For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

When Christ first came to earth, he did not come to condemn he came to save. This comes through loud and clear in John 3: 17, 17 For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him." His saving mission has been completed, when he returns it will be to judge all mankind – the living and the dead as the Apostles creed puts it, or as we can read in John 5: 26 – 29. Jesus said that everyone who has died will be raised from the dead and be judged. So, all of us will stand before "Christ as Judge." At that time may Christ recognise us as his own.

Where did Jesus go when he went back to heaven?

2. Jesus is at the right hand of God

Next, we can take it that Christ's sacrifice on the cross is acceptable to God and as a consequence of this Jesus is glorified and is sitting at the right-hand of God, hence the ascension. Sitting at the righthand is regarded as a position of favour, prestige and honour. It may not be obvious from our reading but if we look at Mark 16: 19 it makes it very clear, "19 After the Lord Jesus had charged the disciples in this way, He was taken up into heaven and seated at the right hand of God.

From this position Jesus exercises dominion overall creation. A view captured in Paul's letter to the church at Ephesus in its opening chapter Friends, it is this same might and resurrection power that 20 He used in the Anointed One to raise Him from the dead and to position Him at His right hand in heaven. There is nothing over Him. 21 He's above all rule, authority, power, and dominion;

The key question is who will confess Jesus now? From the Apostles creed we know that when Christ returns all creation will have to admit he is indeed Lord overall but those who have failed to do so will be judged. Or looking later on in Acts 17: 31 we read 31 because he has appointed a day in which he will judge the world in righteousness by the man whom he has ordained; of which he has given assurance to all men, in that he has raised him from the dead." The key question comes down to this in Matthew 7: 21 21 Not everyone who says to Me, "Lord, Lord," will enter the kingdom of heaven. Simply calling Me "Lord" will not be enough. Only those who do the will of My Father who is in heaven will join Me in heaven. When he comes again, he will return to judge, it will mean complete separation from the father for those he does not recognise as his own. The flip side of the good news is in that bad news of separation.

3. His bodily ascension means we will ascend too

Two weeks ago, I mentioned Enoch and Elijah as people who walked with God and who were both taken up into heaven, they had ascended into heaven. You can read about Enoch



in Genesis 5 24, where it says, "but Enoch had such a close and intimate relationship with God that one day he just vanished - God took him. Enoch leaves this world in an unusual way. He is taken without experiencing death. But he is not the last.

Elijah in 2 Kings 2: 11 is taken up to heaven in a fiery chariot, "11 Now as the two continued walking along and talking as they normally did, something incredible happened. A blazing chariot pulled by blazing horses stormed down from the heavens and came between Elijah and Elisha. Then Elijah was swept up into heaven by the fiery storm."

Both of these two examples differ from Jesus' ascension because neither Enoch nor Elijah died their resurrection was of their earthly bodies. Christ's ascension was of his resurrection body. We know though that when Christ returns, he will raise up the dead. In this resurrection, those who have died believing in Christ will have body and spirits united in a body like Christ's resurrection body. Look at 1 John 3: 2 for confirmation, "2 My loved ones, we have been adopted into God's family; and we are officially His children now. The full picture of our destiny is not yet clear, but we know this much: when Jesus appears, we will be like Him because we will see Him just as He is." When Jesus comes again, we will be like him. Paul writing to the church in Thessalonica (1 Thessalonians 4: 16-17) said, after the dead in Christ rising those that remain, we will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord. So, we too will ascend.

What is he doing in heaven?

4. Jesus is interceding for us

He is advocating for us. In Romans 8: 33 - 34 we plainly see this, "Can anyone be so bold as to level a charge against God's chosen? Especially since God's "not guilty" verdict is already declared. 34 Who has the authority to condemn? Jesus the Anointed who died, but more importantly, conquered death when He was raised to sit at the right hand of God where He pleads on our behalf.

Why do we need to have someone intercede for us if the verdict is in already and it's not guilty? Because in Revelation we learn even at this late-stage Satan is accusing us before God of all sorts of things, as in Then I heard a great voice in heaven saying Now the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God and the authority of His Anointed One have come. For the accuser of our brothers and sisters, who relentlessly accuses them day and night before our God, has been cast down and silenced. I don't know about you, but I have done things that I am not proud of, things that when I stop and think about them, I feel guilty over. But Christ is there pleading my case like a good defence barrister. But why did he have to go back to heaven?

5. So that the Holy Spirit can come

When Jesus walked this earth, he could not be with all of us his earthly body was confined to one geographical place to one moment in time. But now that he has ascended scripture in the form of Matthew 18: 20 tells us that whenever 2 or 3 are gathered in his name there



he is also in our midst. Jesus ascended so that the promised helper/comforter – the Holy Spirit could come and empower us preparing us to that we could live with Christ. Have a quick look at John 16:7 for confirmation, 7 But the truth is that My departure will be a gift that will serve you well, because if I don't leave, the great Helper will not come to your aid. When I leave, I will send Him to you." There is a specific sequence to these events hence Christ having to return to heaven first. When I started talking, I said the ascension marked the end of Christ's earthly ministry, but it did not mean the end of his ministry only that phase of it. As we have seen he acts as our intercessor, he sent the Holy Spirit to empower us, he meets with and convicts us of our sin. His ministry continues it entered a different phase when he ascended but it continues, nevertheless.

6. The work of Christ on earth now resides with the church

Wow — that's a big ask! Christs earthly ministry is now the work of the church! It's down to you and me! I like the bit in our reading where the angel says in effect Well what are you lot hanging about for! Go do what Christ told you to do. We are all called to do his business until he returns. Just like the servants in the parable of the ten minas in Luke 19: 11 - 27 he instructed his servants to do business with this until I return in v 13. Similarly in Matthew 28: we see Jesus instruct the disciples, and by extension us to go spread the word, he said "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Still a work in progress but clearly the work of Church and all his followers.

7. Jesus' return will be like his departure.

What do I mean by that well his return will be with clouds, it will be a bodily return, it will be seen by others? The angels says as much in v 11 The very same Jesus who they had been following for 3 years or more, the same Jesus who was crucified, died, was buried and rose again on the third day, this Jesus who had appeared to them for the last 40 day after his resurrection would return in a like manner.

Consequences

To quote RC Sproul, "The ascension of Jesus was the supreme political event of world history. He ascended not so much to a place as to an office. He departed from the arena of humiliation and suffering to enter into his glory. He, in one moment, leapfrogged from the status of despised Galilean teacher to the cosmic King of the universe, jumping over the heads of Pilate, Herod, and Caesar Augustus. The Ascension catapulted Jesus to the right hand of God, where he was enthroned as King of kings and Lord of lords."

The ascension of Jesus was and is an integral part of the plan of salvation that was determined before the foundation of the world. The ascension is a key part of that plan. Christ paid the price with his life in place of ours to reconcile us to the Father that was another key part of the plan. The next part could only about when Christ ascended making way for the Holy Spirit to come and enter all of our lives to empowers us to follow Christs



example and do the work of the Father. That work is quite simply to go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Also note the full plan for salvation includes all three parts of the Godhead – the father send the son, the son gave his life, the Holy Spirit works on the hearts of man. But I'm spilling over into Pentecost, so I need to pull back a bit.

Oswald Chamber puts it this way At His Ascension our Lord entered heaven, and He keeps the door open for humanity to enter.

Close

We know God loves us the question is do we love God the whole bible seaks of it, hence my question at the start Are you Theophilus? Are you someone who loves God? The bible tells us of God's love for us not least in sending his only begotten son to pay for our sin, but the question is will we reciprocate and love God back?

Prayers of Intercession

The Act of Breaking Bread

When we share the cup of the Lord and break bread together, we express our common participation in the benefits of Jesus' death for us. The apostle Paul tells us of the institution of the Lord's Supper:

For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you:

The Lord Jesus on the night he was betrayed, took bread,

and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, 'This is my body which is for you; do this in remembrance of me.'

In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. (1 Corinthians 11: 23–26)
